The Deaf Lions football team participated in Malaysia Deaf Games 2014 and won the silver medal for the first time in history of deaf football in Singapore.



5) 1st National Deaf Games 2015

14 - 21 March 2015



DSA organized the inaugural National Deaf Games which saw 143 members from the deaf community to participate and compete against one another. This act as a selection platform to identify potential athletes and select them to prepare for the future major games such as Asia Pacific Deaf Games and Deaflympic Games

Deaflympics Games (equivalent to Olympic and Paralympic) is the highest level in the deaf sports world and held by the bidding country once every four years. There is another major games, Asia Pacific Deaf Games which is equivalent to Asian Games and Asian Para Games, is held every four years as well. Coming up next is that the city Taoyuan, will host 8_{th} Asia Pacific Deaf Games in Taiwan from 3 to 11 October 2015.

This event will be annually held to improve higher competitive in the Deaf community to identify more talents.



The Guest of Honor is Deputy Prime Minister Tharman Shanmugaratam who graced the first National Deaf Games Futsal at Jurong East Sports Hall on 14 March 2015. Over 200 spectactors turned up in support of the Deaf Community.
