- To provide technical advice and sharing of knowledge on Deaf sports.


#### **MISSION**

#### 1) SINGAPORE ASSOCIATION FOR THE DEAF

Singapore Association for the Deaf aka SADeaf is the national body that serves the Deaf and Hard of Hearing communities by providing educational and industrial training support through Singapore School for the Deaf and Mountbatten Vocational School. They have several groups such as Singapore Deaf Youth Section and Social Group for the Deaf where they organized many enrichment programmes for their members. They offer services like sign language interpretation services, Singapore Sign Language courses and workshops.

SADeaf works closely with DSA to reach out to the entire community through high participation for example: annual National Deaf Games and talent development system.

Number of SADeaf members: 5,000

#### 2) DEAF & HARD OF HEARING FEDERATION (SINGAPORE)

Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing Federation (Singapore) aka DHHFS is a non-profit organization that provides advocacy for the deaf and hard-of-hearing communities, mostly of them are working adults and seniors. They work together with SADeaf to advocate and improve on several areas; inaccessibility, barriers, discrimination and inequality.

DHHFS works closely with DSA to promote awareness on the deaf sports development and encourages the deaf senior community to pick up recreational and sports.

Number of DHHFS members: 65

#### 3) TOUCH SILENT CLUB

TOUCH Silent Club aka TSC is a service of TOUCH Community Services, a not-for-profit charitable organisation officially registered in 1992 and a member of the National Council of Social Service. TOUCH Silent Club was launched in March 1993 to meet the needs of the deaf community.

TSC works closely with DSA to promote sports awareness and encourage active participation through competitions.

#### **SPORTS AND PROGRAMMES**

#### **SPORT DEVELOPMENT**

Four (4) sports groups have been established to recruit athletes for DSA sports training programmes. Until the end of March 2016, the details of four (4) sports groups are as follow:

#### 1) Badminton development programme

April 2015 - March 2016

The badminton group has been training once-a-week at Singapore Badminton Hall (SBH) since February 2015. The use of SBH badminton court was financially supported by the Arina International Holding Pte Ltd.



The 1<sup>st</sup> Badminton Selection Trial was conducted at Woodlands Sports Hall. Total of 14 potential deaf athletes registered for the trial. And only 6 athletes were selected to join the DSA athletes' preparation and training programme.

#### 2) Bowling development programme

April 2015 – March 2016

The two (2) official selection trials were conducted on 31 May 2015 and 6 March 2016 to identify potential bowlers for DSA elite athletes' preparation and training programme. Six (6) bowlers have been selected for programme.



DSA fully supported Ms Kimberly Quek's participation at the SBF National Youth Bowling Championship 2015. She finished 7<sup>th</sup> place from the total 18 finalists at the Girls Masters event.



#### 3) Swimming development programme

April 2015 – March 2016

From all the swimming participants, Mr Tan Jian Hao was selected for the elite athletes' preparation and training programme. DSA fully supported his participation at Singapore National Games 2015. He achieved bronze medal at Under-24 category.

He was selected to represent Singapore at the 8<sup>th</sup> Asia Pacific Deaf Games 2016 in Taoyuan, Taiwan.



#### 4) Football development programme

April 2015 – March 2016

DSA conducted its first selection trial for the Deaf Football in July 2015. More than 25 applicants registered for the trial. For the first time, deaf youths aged between 14 and 18 years old participated in the trial.



Total of 12 deaf youths have been selected to train under our junior elite preparation, development and training programme

#### 5) 8<sup>th</sup> Asia Pacific Deaf Games 2016

3 – 11 October 2016

DSA sent its national delegates to participate in the 8<sup>th</sup> Asia Pacific Deaf Games held in Taoyuan, Taiwan from 3 – 11 October 2016. The official delegates were as follow:
